HAZARDOUS MATERIALS DISCLOSURE PROGRAM**By: Ruben Angel, Omni Metal Finishing**

Chapter 6.95, Division 20 of the California Health and Safety Code (H&SC) and Chapter 116, Section 11022 of Title 42 of the United States Code contain the minimum requirements for hazardous material inventory reporting and data management. They require that

1. Businesses within the Orange County jurisdiction of Brea to complete a chemical inventory form to disclose hazardous materials stored, used, or handled on site.
2. This disclosure information to assist emergency responders in planning for and handling emergencies involving hazardous materials. The main program objective is to safeguard the lives of emergency responders, the public, and to minimize property loss.
3. The H&SC also requires a *Business Emergency Plan (BEP)*. The intent of the BEP is to assist in mitigating a release or threatened release of a hazardous material; and to minimize any potential harm or damage to human health or the environment. In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 6.95, disclosure of hazardous materials shall be updated at least annually.

These forms will satisfy disclosure requirements of State laws as well as Sections 311 and 312 of Federal law (EPCRA - SARA Title III). This Agency is mandated to maintain files of all chemical inventory and business plans for the businesses within the Agency's jurisdiction.

HAZARDOUS WASTE AND ENVIRONMENTAL FEES**By: Ruben Angel, Omni Metal Finishing**

The Hazardous Waste Generator Fee Return and the Environmental Fee Return will be due on or before February 28, 2011.

The generator fee is imposed on each site that generates or produces hazardous waste of 5 tons or more in each calendar year. This fee is calculated in a tiered-volume basis and the fees assessed increase substantially with the volume generated. It applies regardless of the final disposition of the waste (e.g. recycling, disposal).

The Environmental Fee provides a mechanism for reporting liability of one or more related corporations or other organizations. It may include general partnerships, limited partnerships, limited liability partnerships, limited liability companies, sole proprietorships, and all entity corporate entity types. The fee is established on the total number of employees employed during the calendar year. This fee is progressively set up.

Avoid any penalties and interest charges if not paid by the due date.

AIR QUALITY News: AQMD's Rule 1147

Rule 1147 came into being December 5, 2008 and requires companies to upgrade the gas burners on smaller equipment like tank heaters, furnaces, afterburners, ovens, etc. The new emission limits run from 30-60 ppm NOx. Initial compliance started JAN 1, 2010 with recordkeeping requirements, combustion system maintenance in accordance with manufacturer's operations-service manual, etc. Compliance with new lower emission limits and additional recordkeeping kicked in on July 1, 2010. The District has now agreed to make certain amendments to the original Rule. Each Company affected by this Rule should plan to attend the Public Hearing coming up on March 15th at AQMD in Room GB at 1:30PM

REMEMBER TO RECORD AND REPORT **Courtesy of The State Compensation Insurance Fund**

The beginning of the year is a good time to review and organize recordkeeping and reporting procedures. For employers, Cal/OSHA has specific recordkeeping and reporting requirements relating to safety in the workplace that include the Cal/OSHA 300 Log and documents about safety hazard analysis, inspections, and accident investigations. Hazard-specific activities such as asbestos, diving, mining, etc. require additional recordkeeping procedures. Any notices of Cal/OSHA investigations, or complaints – along with the required employer response – must be posted for 3 days. Copies of Cal/OSHA citations must be posted for 3 days or until the violations are corrected.

Throughout the year, employers must record all work-related deaths – along with injuries and illnesses that require more than first aid treatment – on a Cal/OSHA Form 300, *Log of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses*. Although some small businesses (less than 10 employees) and certain industries may have limited exemptions from this recordkeeping requirement, all employers must report deaths and multiple injury incidents to Cal/OSHA within 8 hours and serious injuries within 24 hours. At the end of the year, the number of incidents on the Log must be transferred to Cal/OSHA's Form 300A, *Annual Summary of Work-Related Injury and Illnesses* and be posted from February 1 through April 30, in a visible location so that employees are aware of the injuries and illnesses that occurred in their workplace.

Employers are required to keep records of all employee safety training. And, although most training records are kept for 5 years, some regulations – such as those for asbestos training – have separate recordkeeping requirements and timelines. Employers should check the specific regulations for storage time requirements for their industry. All employee medical records must be kept for the length of employment plus 30 years.

Every place of employment should have a "Job Safety and Health Protection" poster placed in a prominent area. And, employers are required by Cal/OSHA to investigate all employee accidents, near misses, and employee safety complaints. They must keep records on the hazard evaluations and corrective actions taken to reduce or control workplace safety risks then communicate findings with employees to make them aware of job hazards and help them work safer.

Finally, employers must provide employees access to company safety records within a reasonable timeframe (usually 7 days) and must notify employees when monitoring indicates that they've been exposed to a hazard.
